For the main congress itself, there has been an extensive range of topics covered that will cater to varied interests, beyond the usual interventional, imaging and electrophysiology sessions planned with world-class talks. Other areas covered include the latest in management of metabolic diseases, numerous innovations in cardiology, and sessions on critical care, women in cardiology, sports cardiology, and pulmonary hypertension, amongst many others.

You've already mentioned some of the highlights of the scientific programme for this year. What should people look forward to at APSC and why should we go to APSC?

That's a tough, tough question. All right. Everything has been thoughtfully and meticulously planned, and it's probably quite hard to choose between things. If I may, some highlights will include the vessel sessions by the APSC Young Cardiology Committee. We have a session discussing complex issues in cardiology, like revascularization and antiplatelet therapy, as well as an exciting session on heart failure guidelines. Some other highlights include our plenary session on innovations in valve therapy, and there will be a great lecture delivered by the world-renowned Professor



Chaim Lotan. We also like to encourage everyone to attend some of the industry sessions as these are very educational as well.
